



2016 ACADEMIC RECOGNITION AWARD APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS (HS)

Big Brothers Big Sisters of NYC values academic excellence, community leadership and good sportsmanship. Our annual Academic Recognition Award recognizes and honors the outstanding academic achievements, both in and out of the classroom, of a select group of Little Brothers and Sisters. These youth have shown academic drive, improvement, and accomplishments during the school year.

In order to be considered, you will need to submit an application to Big Brothers Big Sisters of NYC. This is a competitive process. All applications will be reviewed by our Awards Committee.

What needs to be included in your application?

- 1) A typed personal statement written by the student (see pages 3/4).
 - a. All drafts of essays should be submitted to Jordan Joseph (jjoseph@bigsnyc.org) by Monday, March 7th (**Strongly Recommended**)
- 2) An academic letter of recommendation from someone at your school (see page 7)
- 3) A letter of recommendation from your Big (see page 8)
- 4) Your most recent transcript – ask your school for a copy
- 5) Your most recent report card – ask your school for a copy

Please carefully read over all instructions. **A complete application must be submitted to the address listed below no later than Friday, April 1, 2016.** Your application can also be scanned and emailed to jjoseph@bigsnyc.org. Late applications will not be reviewed.

High School Awards:

Grades 9th – 12th

- 1) **Aspiring Scholar** **# to be awarded: 2**
** 9th & 10th graders only **
 - a) Maintain a GPA above 90 (A- or 3.6)
 - b) Displays good citizenship, role modeling and/or leadership in and out of classroom
 - c) Involved in extracurricular activities while also maintaining an average of A- or above

- 2) **Civic Engagement** **# to be awarded: 2**
9th - 12th graders

Exhibits actions aligned with the BBBS mission

 - a) Displays good citizenship, role modeling and/or leadership in and out of classroom
 - b) Active in community service and/or dedicated commitment to an outside project or agency benefiting the community
 - c) Involved in extracurricular activities while also maintaining an average of at least 83(B or 3.0)
 - d) Dedicated commitment to an outside project or agency benefiting the community

- 3) **College Ready** **# to be awarded: 2**
11th and 12th graders only
 - a) GPA of 80 or higher
 - b) Math and/or ELA Regents score of 80 or higher
 - c) Attended and completed at least one BBBS of NYC Education Initiative program in the 2015-2016 school year
 - d) Took AP or College Now course and passed with a score 75 or higher

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES:

Graduating 12th Graders Only

Scholarships are available in the range of \$500 to \$1,500. Funds may be used to support tuition, fees, and any other related academic expenses. To qualify as a recipient of one of the Big Brothers Big Sisters of New York City Scholarship you must:

- a) Be a high school senior who plans to enroll in a full-time undergraduate course of study at an accredited two-or four-year college in the fall semester of 2016
- b) Have a minimum GPA of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale
- c) Be in a Big Brothers Big Sisters of NYC mentoring program

Attention: High School Littles (9th- 11th Grades)

In order for us to select the winners we need to get to know you a little better. This is your chance to tell us about who you are and why you should be considered for an award. Please submit a personal statement **(250-300 words)** telling us all about you. Your statement should include answers to the questions below and anything you want to tell us about yourself. Statement should be typed, detailed, and personalized. Late or incomplete application will not be reviewed/considered. Ask your parents or Big for help if you have any questions!

Your statement should include in your statement:

- a) The importance of academics in your life
- b) Accomplishments you have had in school, including grades and awards
- c) Your greatest strengths as a student
- d) Any improvements you have recently made as a student
- e) Any leadership experiences at school and/or in extracurricular activities also highlight community service experience
- f) How have you worked hard in school?

All Essay draft submitted to jjoseph@bigsny.org by Monday, March 7, 2016 and will be returned with comments by March 16, 2016. Final Drafts must be submitted by April 1, 2016.

Attention: Graduating 12th Grade Littles!

Scholarship and Academic Awards!

In order for the committee to determine who should be awarded, we need to know you better. This is your chance to tell us who you are in your own words. Please submit a personal statement telling us all about you. Your statement should include answers to the questions below and anything you want to tell us about yourself. Be sure to include your personal statement in your application. Late or incomplete application will not be reviewed/considered.

Scholarship personal statements should be 300 – 500 words. **They must be typed.** Scholarship awards amounts vary.

- 1) Tell us about yourself - name, age, about your personal journey, the college you will attend in the fall (if known) and the colleges you were accepted to, your career aspirations, and your motivation to succeed
- 2) The importance of academics in your life
- 3) Accomplishments you have had in school, including grades and awards
- 4) Your greatest strengths as a student and how you plan on using that in college
- 5) Improvements you have recently made as a student
- 6) Leadership experiences at school and/or in extracurricular activities also highlight community service experience
- 7) Anything else you want us to know

Essay draft must be submitted to jjoseph@bigsnyc.org no later than Friday, March 2, 2016 and will be returned with comments by March 16, 2016. Final Drafts must be submitted by April 1, 2016.

Instructions for Letters of Recommendations

Big Brothers Big Sisters of NYC requires **TWO** letters of recommendation as part of your Academic Recognition Awards application. These letters are a key component of your application and must be included.

One letter needs to be written by a school official. This person can be a teacher, guidance counselor or sports coach and should be familiar with your academic performance. It is your job to ask this person to write a letter of recommendation for you. Follow these steps to start the process:

- ❑ This person should be familiar with your academic performance and have a good understanding of you and your strengths
- ❑ Perhaps most important, pick someone who will be enthusiastic about writing the letter for you
- ❑ It will take some time for them to write the letter so be sure to ask them right away and give them the blue or pink colored instructional sheet.

The second letter needs to be written by your Big Brother/Sister.

Applications are due to Big Brothers Big Sisters of NYC no later than Friday, April 1, 2016 so please make sure they return your letter to you ahead of time.

How to get the best recommendations

Even though they know you well, it's a good idea to take some time to speak with them. Make it easy for them to give positive, detailed information about your academic achievements and your potential by refreshing their memory.

Here's how:

- ❑ Talk to them about your class participation
- ❑ Remind them of specific work or projects you're proud of
- ❑ Tell them what you learned in class
- ❑ Mention any challenges you overcame
- ❑ Give them the information they need to provide specific examples of your work
- ❑ Talk about your accomplishments, hobbies and plans for college and the future
- ❑ If you need to discuss part of your transcript, for example a low grade in a particular class, do so. Explain why you had difficulty and discuss how you have changed and improved since then.

Final tips

The following advice is easy to follow and can really pay-off:

- ▣ Make sure your references know the deadline. Applications are due to BBBS of NYC no later than Friday, April 1, 2016 so you will need them to send you this letter ahead of time.
- ▣ Follow up with your references a week or so before the letters of recommendations are due to make sure your letters have been sent back to you
- ▣ Write thank-you notes. Let them know how much you appreciate their support.
